Hip hip hooray! Today is the day.

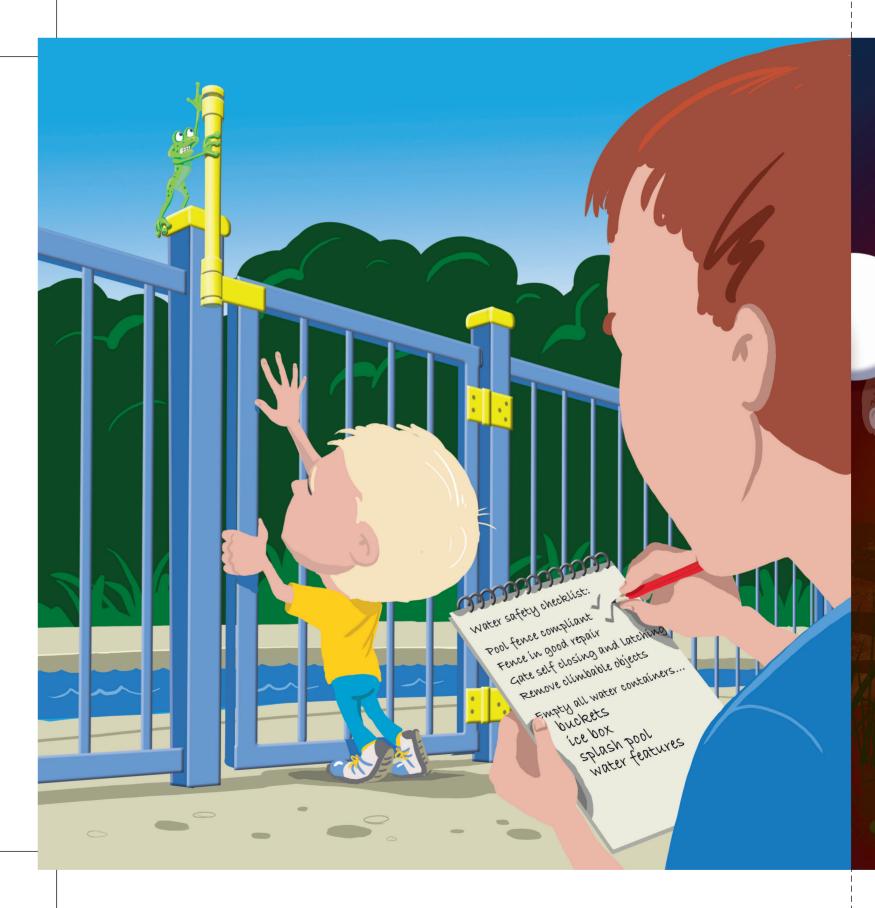
Our new baby is coming home to play.

About water safety and what we must do.

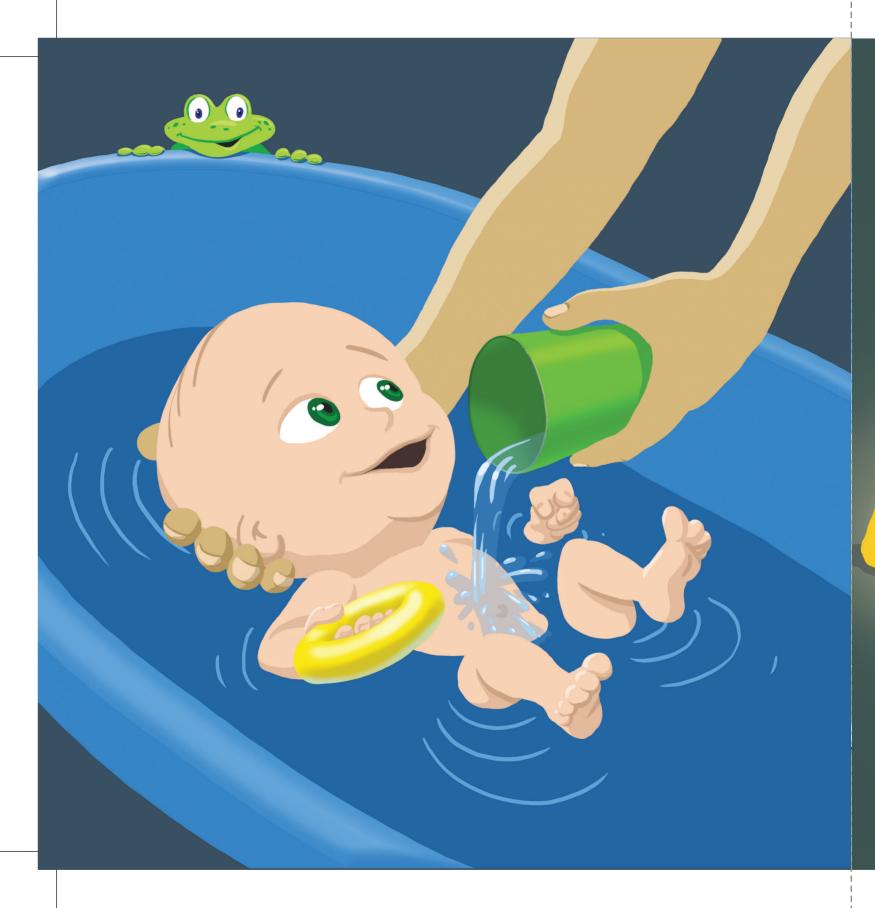


Let's prepare for an emergency situation,









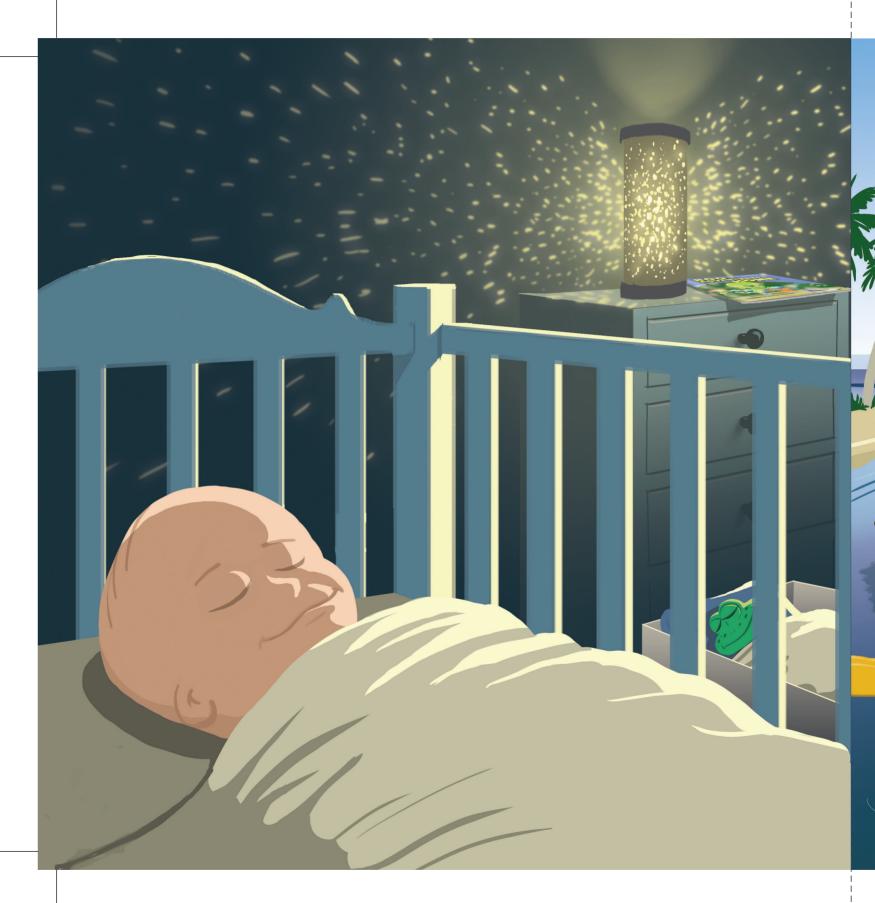
Baby's first bath is fun and exciting,

As soon as we finish we must pull the plug,

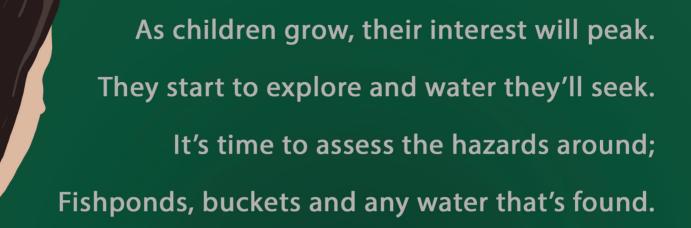
We wrap baby up with a towel and a hug.





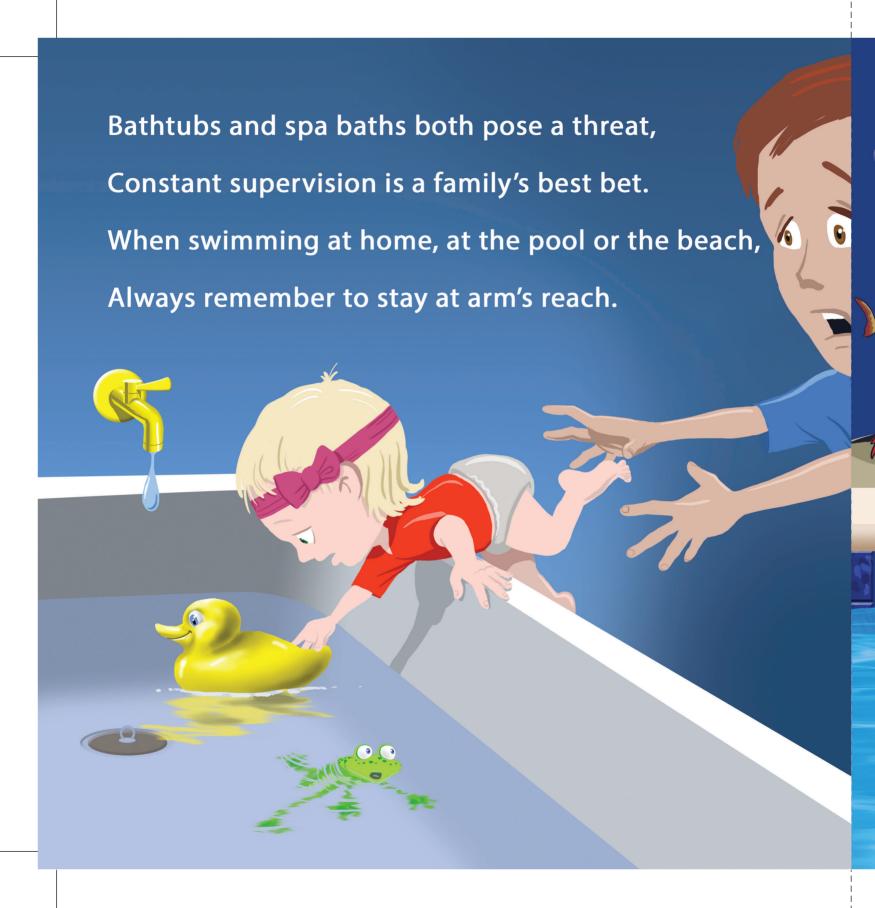
Shower or bath then get ready for bed,

Whether we live in the city, the beach or a farm.





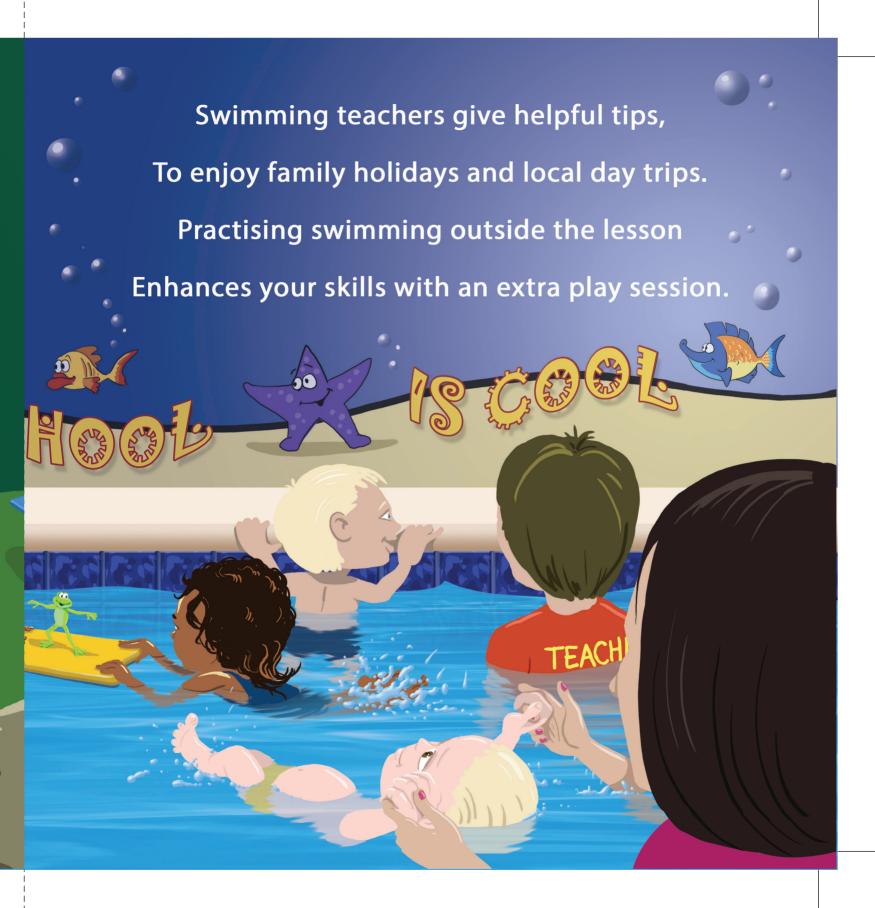












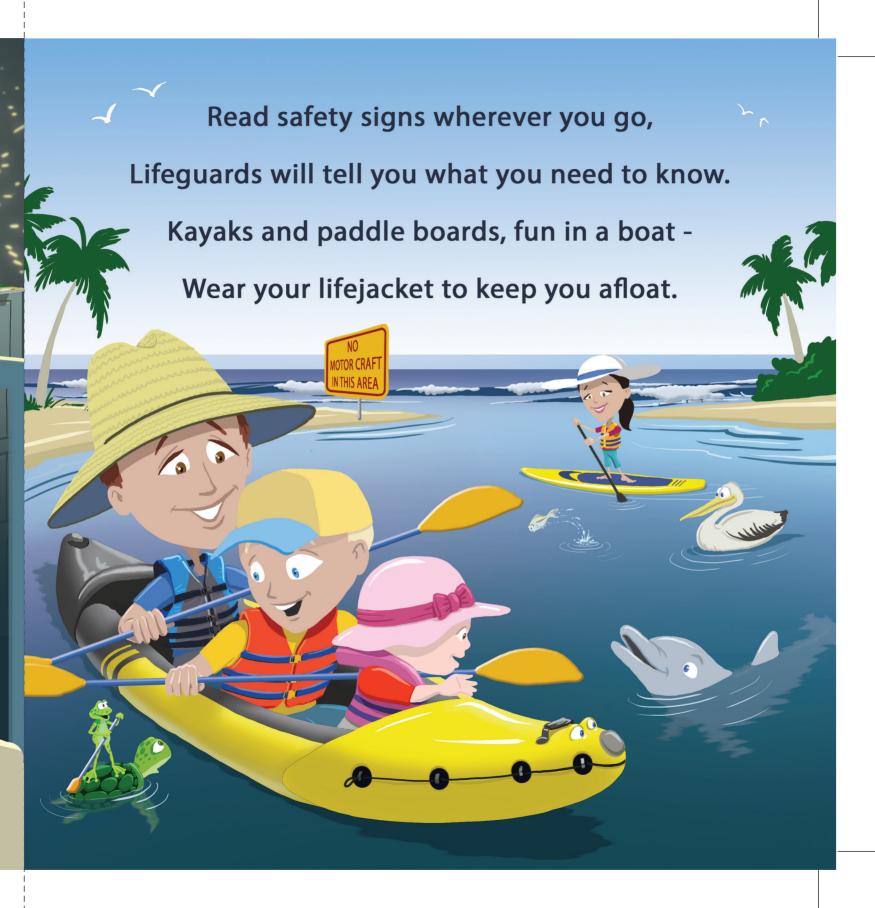
There are many environments for water play;

So much to enjoy - don't forget your sunscreen!









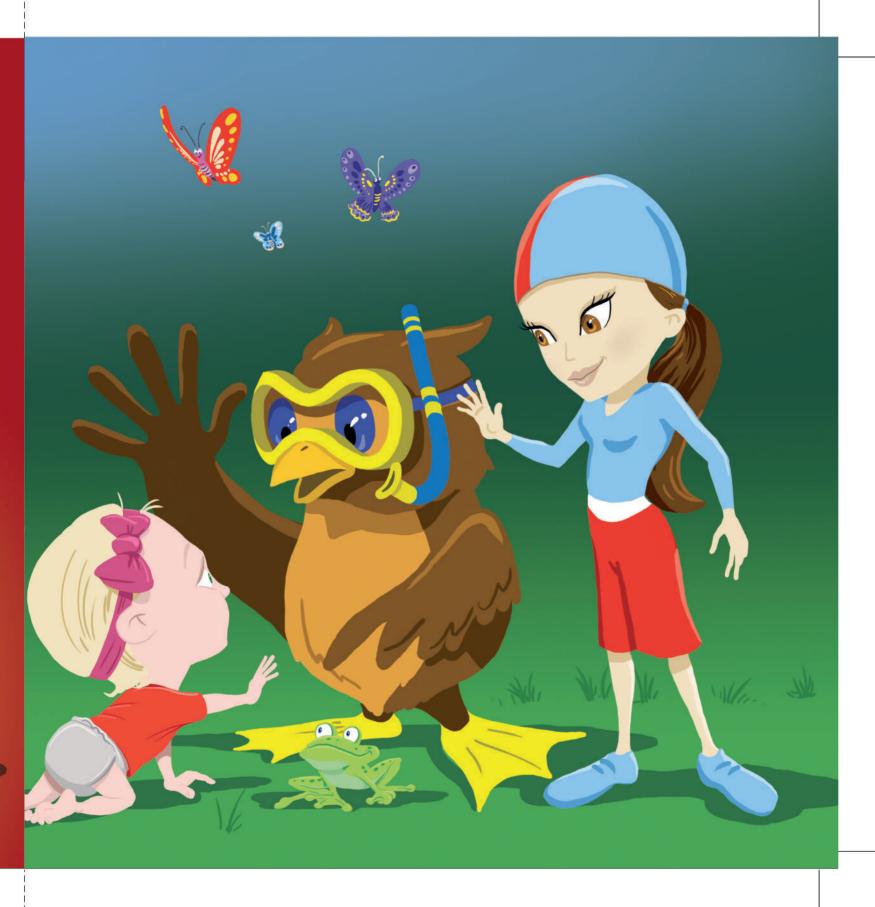
When learning about safety, we meet some new friends.

Lifesaver Lil and Wise Owl are true gems.

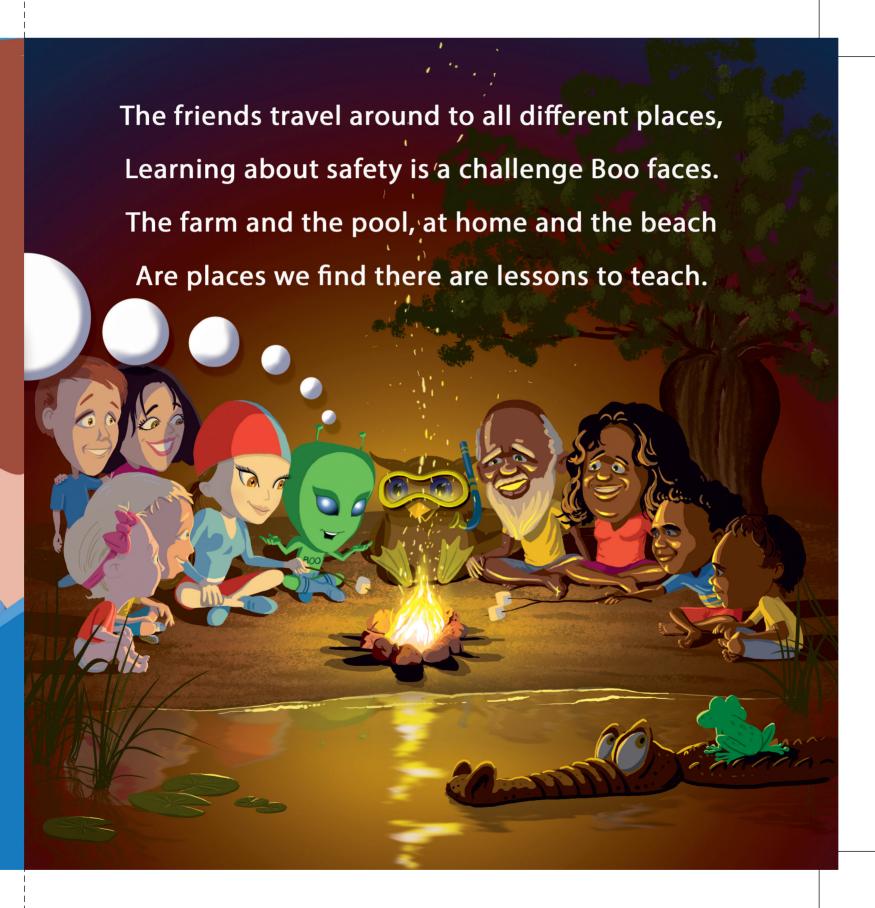
Alien Boo likes to explore,

Safety Warnings

- Never leave baby unsupervised in the bath
- Supervise baby within arms reach
- Be in a position to respond quickly
- Ensure you have all bath equipment organised before bathing baby
- Avoid distractions eq. mobile phones, household chores, television, doorbells
- · If you leave the bathroom take baby with you
- · Empty bath water immediately after use
- Regularly check your home for water hazards
- · Nappy bins, buckets, eskies, water play shells all pose a danger
- · Backyard swimming pools pose the greatest risk to children under 5
- Ensure pool gates and fences are compliant and well maintained
- Remove climbable objects from pool area eq. chairs, pot plants, play equipment
- · Ensure children have a safe play area and are restricted from accessing open bodies of water
- Learn CPR so that you are able to respond in an emergency

Safety Tips

- We want to maintain baby's natural affinity with the water
- · Bath time can be a wonderful bonding experience and fantastic for stimulation
- · During bath time, look in your baby's eyes, smile, talk, stroke and wash them gently
- Parents may also enjoy getting into a big bath with their baby, this can make it easier to hold and interact with your baby
- · The bath can be very relaxing for baby and a wonderful way to lead into a bedtime routine
- Reading is also fantastic to include in your baby's bedtime routine
- · Enjoy reading this book with your baby to promote bonding, early literacy and water safety

Suggestions

- If your baby is crying during bath time, remain calm and try to find the underlying problem Are they hungry, over tired, or uncomfortable with the water temperature?
- You may need to adjust the time that you bath your baby to a time when they are happy, alert and ready for stimulation and play
- Newborn babies can get startled when lowering into the bath water try to bring their arms
 together so they feel secure, lower them gently into the water and place their feet at the base of
 the bath
- Don't rush through bath time as this can make it stressful for both you and your baby
- · Enjoy bath and waterplay and have lots of fun together
